A shared access signature (SAS) provides secure delegated access to resources in your storage account without compromising the security of your data. With a SAS, you have granular control over how a client can access your data.

Use the SAS LIBNAME Statement for a Microsoft Access Database In this example, you assign the libref TEST to the AnnualFiles database. You then create a temporary SAS data set, TEMP1, from the Customers table in the database. Notice that this LIBNAME statement specifies the PCFILES engine.

Generally speaking, SharePoint documents could be -anything- a Word doc, an HTML page, a PPT presentation, an Excel spreadsheet, a text file. The URL option of the FILENAME statement is most often used to access an HTML file and read an HTML table out of the HTML file and INTO a SAS dataset or to read a text file, as described here:
